Due dates

Water and sewer bills are due on **April 30**, July 31, and October 31.

Payment options

Pre-authorized payments

Pre-authorized payment plans allow you to set up automatic withdrawals from your bank each month or on the due date. Sign up for pre-authorized payments at: severn.ca/waterbill.

Cheque

Pay by cheque (to Township of Severn) by mail (PO Box 159, Orillia, ON L3V 6J3) or drop box (1024 Hurlwood Lane, Severn).

Banking

Pay through online or telephone banking or in person at a financial institution using your **NEW Utilcode number** located above your civic address on the top right of your bill.

Water and sewer rates

Water and sewer services are billed quarterly on a base charge of 68 cubic metres (m³).

Sewer rate for Coldwater, Washago, and Westshore

The 2024 sewer rate is \$213.47 per quarter and \$3.32 per m³ for any use over 68 m³.

Water rate for Bass Lake Woodlands, Coldwater, Sandcastle Estates, Severn Estates, Washago, and Westshore

The 2024 water rate is \$216.64 per quarter and \$2.86 per m³ for any use over 68 m³.

Is your bill higher than expected?

High water bills are usually a result of running toilets, leaky faucets, or problems with automatic trap fillers.

Complete a water audit

Turn off all sources of water in the house and check the flow indicator on your meter. If the indicator is moving when all taps and washers are off, you have a leak. Monitor your average consumption by regularly checking your meter. This will allow you to notice any irregularities that could result in excess charges.

Drinking water quality

We deliver clean and safe drinking water in Severn from our six municipal drinking water systems:

- Bass Lake Woodlands
- Coldwater
- Sandcastle Estates
- Severn Estates
- Washago
- Westshore

We follow the drinking water quality management standards outlined in the Safe Drinking Water Act. Annual water quality reports are available for your review at: severn.ca/drinkingwaterquality.

Water conservation

Here are some tips to help you conserve water:

- don't over water your lawn (only requires 2.5 cm of water per week)
- avoid watering your lawn during the hottest part of the day
- check that water softeners do not start continually running after a power outage
- invest in water and energy saving units
- use a broom instead of a hose to clean sidewalks and driveways
- cover your swimming pool to reduce evaporation up to 90%

1. Make an emergency plan



In the event of an emergency you may become separated from your family or loved ones, or you may have to leave your home. Knowing what you and others would do if an emergency happens is important to keep everyone safe.

2. Build an emergency kit



An emergency kit should include items that you and your family would need to stay safe and healthy for at least three days. Make sure your emergency kit is easy to carry and that everyone in the household knows where it is.

3. Stay informed



During an emergency, you should stay tuned to local news channels. Keep a portable, battery-operated, or crank radio in your emergency kit. Don't forget to include extra batteries.
